Why and how is NCCVT implementing 'It's Not Okay' programming for students?



#1. Senate Bill 290

Expands Erin's Law for grades 7 - 12 to require training and education on issues related to inappropriate relationships between adults and children, such as grooming. Erin's Law requires a curriculum to be used by Delaware's public schools to educate public school employees about personal body safety and child sexual abuse. It also expands the information available to parents and students to include information on the warning signs of adult sexual misconduct



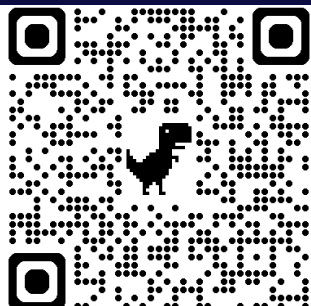
#2. Delivering CPAC's 'It's Not Okay' Lesson

NCCVT will be utilizing the 'It's Not Okay' module to launch the educational programming that will discuss sexual abuse and other forms of child abuse, as well as ways for your child to get help and support. Tentative plans are for a one day lesson to be delivered in a 1-hour delay schedule.



#3. Making a Difference

The Division of Family Services explains that 'together, we can all make a difference in the life of a child. It starts with prevention, education and awareness. The signs of child abuse and neglect may not always be as obvious as a broken bone or bruise. There are behavioral and physical indicators that can give you clues.'
