Herman Holloway Sr.

Herman Holloway Sr. was born in 1922. He grew up in Wilmington, Delaware. After graduating from Howard High, he attended the Hampton Institute for one year. In 1963, Holloway was elected to serve the unexpired term of Paul Livingston in the Delaware House of Representatives. One year later, in 1964, he became the first Black person elected to Delaware's state Senate from the Second District of New Castle County. Since 1964, Holloway has returned to office at every election.

By 1988, Holloway was the most tenured legislator in the Delaware Assembly. No other legislator elected in the nation (at any level of government) had more continuous service than Senator Holloway.
